PROVIDING A LONG-TERM HOUSING SOLUTION

IDP EMERGENCY HOUSING

With Rotary Kyiv we have funded **23 x 500 bed shelters housing 11,500 displaced persons** in key locations across Ukraine where the most devastation has occurred.

- Shelters are completed in 2 weeks by volunteers by repurposing public buildings kindergartens, sanitoriums and halls

These centres primarily house children, women and the elderly who have fled their homes with little more than a suitcase.

- It is long-term accommodation 24 months or more, as most IDP's have no home to return to. Some residents lost their homes in 2014 and now again have lost everything they owned
- All bedding, furnishing, white goods, kitchen fit outs etc. are new and purchased in Ukraine.

This supports the Ukrainian economy and provides employment in manufacturing.

Cost AU \$3,227,767



• “A 66-year-old father said: “We fled our home under heavy artillery fire taking whatever we could in one suitcase each. My wife and my wife's parents have chronic diseases. I have diabetes and hypertension. We are dependent on medicine, and due to my physical condition, I cannot go to work. I am a pensioner, so - there is no possibility to find a job to pay for housing.

• I am grateful to the donors of this shelter that we are not on the street and to the shelter’s volunteers. They are very attentive, respond to any request, and give us advise. And according to their advice and recommendations, we somehow get through each day ”.



Caritas Ukraine “New Safe Home” project

Complex relief services for children and their families fleeing the Russian war in Ukraine.

- Providing appropriate domestic settings and immediate complex psychosocial support to displaced families with children
 - including psychological aid, leisure and art therapy for children
 - restoring learning process
 - fostering of the integration of IDPs in the hosting community
- Specialist assistance & counselling is provided to assist residents to overcome the trauma of war and/or their personal life and regain confidence and life skills to work and live unsupported.
- Only one family is accommodated per room
- Socialisation is being encouraged by assisting with employment & children attending the local school
- Self-sufficiency is encouraged through community cooking, gardens and projects
- ❖ To counter fear & vulnerability the shelter is gated and tucked away in the woods of a village.

Building repurpose, fit out and 12month program Cost: \$175,000 AU

2023 – 2024 \$120,000





❖ Residents:

- displaced mothers with children who have lost their spouses due to the war
- displaced families with children who left their homes because they had been damaged or attacked in the war
- mothers with children who survived severe traumatic events during the war and need intensive psychological support.
- low-income large families with three and more children and low-income single-parent families with children
- women with children with disabilities, who need specialized conditions and care.

❖ Number of vulnerable IDPs and program success underpins an immediate need to provide additional such shelters

2021-2022 “Veterans Social Adaptions Program”

In collaboration with Caritas Ukraine and Nazareth Rehabilitation Centre .
Substance or alcohol addition is one of the greatest demons of post war trauma and impacts the whole family

- 63 veterans and 30 wives are undergoing a specialist in-house rehabilitation program at Nazareth Rehab Centre
- 10 coaches will be identified and trained to commence a “Veteran Peer Support Groups”
- AFUO Handicap bathrooms, rooms and ramps built

Nazareth Rehabilitations & family protection 2022 2023 2024

- Veterans are completing this program whilst
- New short programs have been created to assist the vast number of civilians and veterans who are victims of Post Traumatic Stress.
- As well Nazareth is housing 90 IDP’s requiring special assistance and support.

\$ 123,000 cost, plus IDP Support

\$ 30,000 AU has been provided to modify a building into a gymnasium to improve both mental and physical health

2023 – 24 Funding is expected to be \$238,000

Ukraine Needs Ambulances Program - \$160,000

In a life and death situation, a fully equipped ambulance or evac vehicle can be your lifeline.

Our first Australian convoy of ambulances was delivered to Lviv 24.11.2024. Partnering with Medical Life Lines Ukraine in the UK, a team of self-funded volunteers drove from London to Lviv where they were handed four ambulances to the Ministry of Health in Ukraine.

They were then distributed to hospitals across Ukraine close to the front lines.

The ambulances were loaded to the brim with lifesaving supplies and equipment.

In August four med evac vehicles were funded. These vehicles are imperative to saving lives as they are able to drive where an ambulance cannot through rough and destroyed terrain to evacuate the injured.

Updated infrastructure

- The renovated building of the city trauma center will provide the possibility of serving patients at the rate of 30-70 visits per shift and serve 400,000 residents of the city of Mykolaiv, as well as people from other districts of the Mykolaiv region
- Prompt and effective provision of trauma outpatient care to injured city residents without the involvement of hospital staff and in modern and comfortable conditions for patients.
- Improvement of the territory
