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1. OVERALL GOAL (IMPACT)

Contribute to resilient children and parents through sustainable tailored services for families who find themselves in difficult living situations in Ukraine because of the Russian-Ukrainian war. **TARGET GROUP(S) / BENEFICIARIES**

DIRECT BENEFICIARIES: DISPLACED BOYS AND GIRLS OF DIFFERENT AGE GROUPS FROM **0** UP TO **18** Y.O. AND THEIR FAMILIES (MOTHERS OR CAREGIVERS). THE SELECTION CRITERIA ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- DISPLACED MOTHERS WITH CHILDREN WHO HAVE LOST THEIR SPOUSES DUE TO THE WAR;

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- DISPLACED FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN WHO LEFT THEIR HOMES BECAUSE THEY HAD BEEN DAMAGED OR ATTACKED IN THE WAR;

- MOTHERS WITH CHILDREN WHO SURVIVED SEVERE TRAUMATIC EVENTS DURING THE WAR AND ARE IN NEED OF INTENSIVE PSYCHOLOGICAL SUPPORT.

- LOW-INCOME LARGE FAMILIES WITH THREE AND MORE CHILDREN AND LOW-INCOME SINGLE-PARENT FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN;

- WOMEN WITH CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES, WHO NEED SPECIALIZED CONDITIONS AND CARE.

THE PROJECT AIMED TO COVER A TOTAL OF UP TO **30** FAMILIES AND **60** CHILDREN

DURING THE REPORTED 3 MONTH PERIOD THE NUMBER OF THE PROJECT BENEFICIARIES WHO LIVES IN NAZARETH, VILLAGE DOBRIVLJANY COVERED ARE 8 CHILDREN AND 5 PARENTS/CAREGIVERS (SEE BREAK DOWN GENDER, AGE AND VULNERABLE CATEGORIES BELOW).

3. CURRENT SITUATION

The current political and socio-economic situation in Ukraine in 2023 remains extremely difficult and tense due to the Russia's large-scale aggression. Rocket attacks and shelling continue in eastern Ukraine, making it impossible for families to return home (several families have attempted to return to their homes, but have returned to Nazareth due to constant shelling). Tension between the local population and the internally displaced people still exists, including due to Russia's information war against Ukraine. Children are under constant stress due to the ongoing war, homesick, worried about their parents fighting at the front, and facing difficulties due to the language barrier.

Statistical data of the project (total):

29 families were covered by the project services from 01/09/2023 to 01/12/2023.

40 children - from 2 years to 15 years – participating in the proposed activities (1 child under one year old does not participate in activities and 1 child does not participated in activities due to mental disabilities).

13 volunteers were involved in project activities.

4 families and 7 children currently staying at the center (as of 01/12/2023).

The number of classes held during the project's operation - 126 classes (2 classes per workday and activities on Saturdays).

5. PROJECT ACTIVITIES

OUTCOME 1. The displaced families with children are provided with the temporary accommodation in the shelter of Caritas Sambir-Drohobych in village Dobrivljany

The activities as planned

- Caritas Sambir-Drogobych provides the accommodation in well-equipped rooms with all necessary facilities for living. 30 families with 60 children will be benefited from the service during 12 months.
- The project team buys laptops and a printer for children's school needs.

The activities implemented

- Bought a printer for school chidren's needs.
- The IDP families with children were provided with the temporary accommodation in the shelter

Justification of the deviation – N/A

OUTCOME 2: Displaced children access safe and protective learning environments (received help with entering children to kindergartens and schools), can grow and develop according to their age and needs.

The activities as planned

- To provide the children with psycho-social support, leisure and recreation activities according to the age of children.
- To organize learning and developmental program for children and support them in their process of integration into new school environment and kindergarten environment.
- To provide of consultation and social accompaniment to the families.
- To control psychosocial condition of children and to consult parents regarding it.
- To provide parents with consultations regarding psychosocial support for children, building good relationships, creating a favorable, safe and supportive environment for children and placing them into local schools.
- To carry out integration activities for all children and parents to facilitate making friends, mutual understanding and solidarity based on common values, as well as for sharing positive emotions, creating networks of support and restoring resilience.
- To provide children with extra lessons (individual or in groups) for additional explanation of the material on main school subjects (with help of volunteers in-person or on-line).

The activities implemented

- The children are provided with psycho social support, leisure and recreation in accordance with their age. Vacation activities in format of day camps were organized on the territory of the center to restore children's mental and physical strength.
- - Counseling and social support was provided to families.
- Parents were counseled on psycho social support for their children, building good relationships, creating a safe and supportive environment for their children, and enrolling them in local schools for the next school year.

- Integration activities were organized for all children and parents to promote familiarity, understanding and solidarity based on shared values, as well as to share positive emotions, create support networks and rebuild resilience. This includes joint holidays and excursions.
- - Children are given additional lessons (individual or in a group) to further explain the material in core school subjects.
- - Excursions and joint integration activities are organized.
- - Psychological correction and counseling for children with mental disorders are organized and referred to appropriate developmental centers in Drohobych.

Justification of the deviation – N/A

OUTCOME 3: Displaced children and adults receive psychological support

The activities as planned

- To provide of psychological assistance to the adults and children.
- To integrate displaced families into society (to help with employment, to help with entering into schools and kindergartens).

The activities implemented

- The project psychologist provide group psycho-social activities for children and parents
- IDP children are attending the local schools and kindergartens.
- The adults are helped with employment and obtaining material assistance from the state and government for their basic needs.

10. CHALLENGES IN THE PROJECT ENVIRONMENT AND HOW THEY WERE RESOLVED

Hindering factors in the project implementation

The logistic difficulties due to the bad road to the center, especially in bad weather conditions.

(Repairing of the side road from the highway to the house was started in late summer and finished in the end of autumn. We cleared the roadside, installed drainage (it was necessary because it was impossible to walk on the road during rains), and restored the concrete road. The road repairs have improved access and movement for children and families living in Nazareth, as well as those attending the children's center in Nazareth. Due to the weather conditions and heavy snowfall, it is not possible to make a photo report at the moment (as soon as the weather conditions become better, we will send you a photo report).

11. LESSONS LEARNT AND PLANS FOR NEXT PROJECT PERIOD

NECESSARY CHANGES AND CORRECTIONS, AND USEFUL LESSONS LEARNT, PLANS FOR NEXT PROJECT PERIOD

- To continue repairing the emergency section of the road to the New Safe Home shelter.
- Increase the number of families and children living in the Shelter.
- Expand the list of courses for children and women.
- Creating a trusting relationship between social workers and new beneficiaries.
- Involvement of neighboring villages and towns and IDPs in the mini-integration activities.


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
